

DofE Gold & Silver Expeditions

There were some adventurous Gold D of E expeditions this summer. In July, two groups planned to travel 40 miles from from Loch Arkaig to the sea. The expedition was tough both physically and mentally, with the need to keep going through very wild unforgiving country and weather that made no concessions.
